

The Prince invites them all to a ball, but Tony, knowing the Prince's character, begs Prudence not to go. She is compelled to break her promise, for it so happens that the Princess has returned to France and is in disguise as a mannequin at Madame Blum's Salon, hotly pursued by the irrepressible Larose, Chief of Police, who appears in many disguises, but who cannot disguise nature's handiwork in the shape of a very obvious and very comic limp. Unfortunately the Prince has recognised Princess Mathilde among the mannequins, and threatens to disclose the fact to Larose unless Prudence consents to accompany him to the ball, so for the sake of Mathilde she reluctantly breaks her promise to Tony.

When Tony learns this, he is wise enough to see the wisdom of it all, and begs forgiveness for having doubted her.

Thus the little story comes to a bright and happy end.




