Synopsis

ROBERT TRETHEWEY has arranged to meet his friends at Trethewey Mount, the old forsaken mansion which has belonged to his family for generations. There he finds Jenny Hosken, the descendant of Jenny Polwhele, a village girl, who had been in love with Robert's great-great-grandfather.

The scene goes back one hundred years to the night that Sir John and Lady Trethewey are giving a ball on the eve of the eighth of May. They are waiting to welcome Margaret Stanley, daughter of a rich American friend of Sir John's, who has been chosen by him to be his son's bride to save the family estate. Owing to an unfortunate chain of circumstances, Robert's meeting with Margaret is deferred and in the meantime he publicly expresses his unwillingness to be a party to his father's arrangement. When he and Margaret do eventually meet they fall in love. Jenny Polwhele, the village girl who has been Robert's childhood companion, is madly jealous and spreads superstitious rumours among the villagers, who look upon Margaret as an "unwelcome foreigner" and treat her with coldness and suspicion.

Margaret and Robert marry, but are finally driven from Trethewey Mount by the hostility of the village folk and the house is left to decay until the present time when the great-great-grandson of the original Margaret and Robert returns.

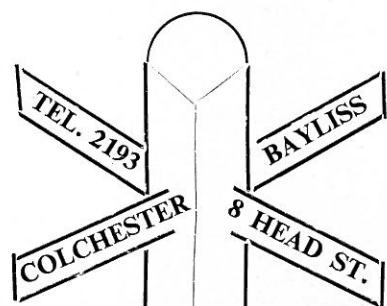

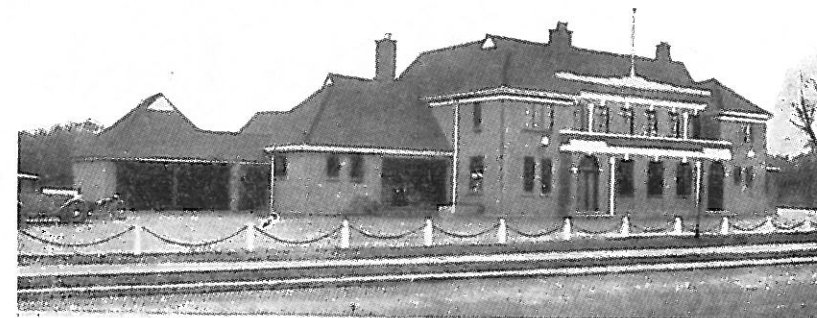
