





Story of the Play

HE SCENE is set prior to 1914 at The White Horse Inn, situated at St. Wolfgang on the shores of Lake Wolfgang in the Salzkammergut, a province of Northern Austria. Josepha, the proprietress, is an attractive widow whose husband died three years before the play opens. She has had to dismiss five successive head waiters for making love to her, and the present head waiter, Leopold, has also succumbed to her charms. Josepha has eyes only for Valentine Sutton, a young English solicitor who is a regular visitor to the Inn.

The many tourists include Mr. Grinkle, an Oldham underwear manufacturer, and his attractive daughter, Ottoline. Valentine Sutton arrives on his annual visit and falls in love with her. A rival underwear manufacturer, Sigismund Smith, also arrives and becomes interested in Gretel, a young lady travelling with her father, Professor Hinzel.

Leopold, desperately in love with Josepha, annoys her at the market and is dismissed. He hears at a Council Meeting that the Emperor of Austria, Franz Joseph, is coming to St. Wolfgang to open the shooting season. Knowing that the Emperor will wish to stay at The White Horse Inn, Leopold returns to tell Josepha the news. She is dismayed and begs Leopold to stay and look after him. He agrees, but overwhelmed in the presence of Imperial Majesty, he flounders in his reception address, loses his head completely and has to be removed from the scene. The kindly old Emperor, however, extracts the truth from Josepha of Leopold's hopeless love. He writes some verses in her birthday book which seem to condone Leopold's offence and eventually are to help him to win her love.

In the meantime the love affairs of Sutton and Ottoline, Gretel and Sigismund have progressed in spite of Grinkle's objections.

Leopold comes to say goodbye to Josepha, but after all she decides to take him back—as joint proprietor of The White Horse Inn.






