THE STORY

Coloured folk work on the Missisippi of the 1890's while the white folk play. But everyone is looking forward to the arrival of Captain Andy's showboat with its jolly comedies and melodramas. On this trip, though, it isn't only the showboat audience who have some surprises in store. Leading lady, Julie Laverne, has to leave the boat after the odd job man Pete, bitter at her rejection of him, discovers she is a half-caste. Mixed marriage is forbidden in Louisiana so she and her husband, leading man Stephen Baker, flee the state.

The brash and bubbly comedienne of the troop, Ellie, who is doted on by Frank, begs Captain Andy to let her take over as leading lady. But it is Magnolia, the innocent and over-protected daughter of Andy and his vitriolic wife Parthy, who gets the part. A new figure steps in to play opposite her. He is Gaylord Ravenal, a riverboat gambler, and for Magnolia it is love at first sight. She confides her feelings to Joe, the easy-going, liquor-loving husband of the boat's cook, Queenie. The only advice he can give is embodied in his song - Ol' Man River. It becomes more and more obvious that the feelings the new leading couple have for each other are more than make-believe. Despite objections from Parthy, Magnolia marries her gambler.

The second half of the show opens at Chicago's World Fair. Ravenal is riding high on his luck, and Magnolia and her new daughter, Kim, have all the trappings of wealth. But fortune changes swiftly and when Ravenal's luck runs out he abandons his family. They are found living in poverty by Frank and Ellie, who are now married and enjoying success on the stage. Frank persuades Magnolia to audition as a singer at the Trocadero Restaurant.

The restaurant's resident singer is Julie. She has been abandoned by Steve, and finds her solace in drink. When she hears Magnolia sing she slips away. Once again it is Julie who sacrifices her career so that Magnolia may be given a chance.

More than thirty years elapse and Magnolia has become a star. It is the ever-forgiving Andy who meets Ravenal by chance and suggests a reconciliation with Magnolia and Kim. Times and fortunes have changed for all the characters of the showboat - the only permanence in life is "OI 'Man River - he jes' keeps rollin' along".
