

THE STORY

The Story of "Brigadoon" begins 200 years ago when it vanished into the Highland mists to emerge only once in every 100 years.

On such a day two Americans — Tommy Albright and his friend, Jeff Douglas, stumble on the village and become for a while part of the world that has stood still for over a century. Here they meet Fiona MacKeith and Meg Brockie.

Tommy and Fiona find in each other a deep understanding, but Jeff is kept constantly on his guard against the affectionate advances of Meg.

The two friends accept an invitation to the wedding of Charlie Cameron and Jean MacKeith, Fiona's sister, but while waiting at the MacKeith house they are bewildered by some of the entries in the family Bible, and ask Fiona for an explanation.

Fiona takes them to see Mr. Murdoch, the old schoolmaster, who tells them of the miracle and what happened 200 years before. He points out that if any of the villagers should try to leave Brigadoon the miracle will be over, but that a stranger could stay if he loved someone well enough to give up everything in the world outside, because if one loves deeply everything is possible.

The wedding of Jean and Charlie, presided over by Mr. Murdoch proceeds with Scottish simplicity and charm, and is followed by traditional dancing by the clans in celebration. Harry Ritchie has always loved Jean and asks to be allowed to dance with the bride. Suddenly the happy gathering is hushed by a scream from Jean as Harry, unable to contain his jealousy, breaks away and makes for the bridegroom with a dirk. Tommy comes between them and throws Harry to the ground. Getting slowly to his feet Harry faces the gathering and tells them that as he cannot have Jean he will leave Brigadoon and thus break the spell for ever.

Before the astonished villagers can stop him he dashes into the forest, followed by the men whose only aim is to prevent him leaving. The poor tormented Harry is eventually found lying dead at the foot of a rock, and his body is carried back to the village. Then the ritual of mourning is danced by Maggie to the lament on the pipes.

Tommy breaks the news to Fiona that he must return to America as he is uncertain whether he is prepared to give up the outside world in order to remain with her in Brigadoon. Back in his own country Tommy tells the girl he is engaged to that something has happened which makes it impossible for him to go through with the wedding, and on seeing a vision of Fiona decides to return at once to Brigadoon.

Jeff travels back to the Highlands with him and when Mr. Murdoch appears out of the mists Tommy crosses the bridge with the old schoolmaster's words ringing in his ears: "If you love someone deeply anything can happen".
