The Story

THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE

The Pirates are discovered on shore, celebrating Frederic's coming of age and the completion of his apprenticeship. We learn from his former nurserymaid, Ruth, that she had wrongly apprenticed him to become a Pirate, rather than a Pilot, at the age of 8, and he, being a lad of conscience and a slave of duty, felt bound to see things through. Now at 12 o'clock, he will be free, and Ruth, the only woman he has seen since boyhood, hopes to go with him.

When Frederic encounters the numerous daughters of Major-General Stanley, he realizes that Ruth is no young beauty, but as he spurns Ruth so, it seems, he in turn will be spurned by the girls.

Mabel appears and takes pity on him, her sisters making every attempt to overhear their conversation. Frederic gives them a warning about the Pirates, but too late, and the girls seem about to be married off to the Pirates when the Major-General enters. He knows that they are soft-hearted and so pleads that he is an orphan and cannot spare his daughters.

At the beginning of Act II, the Major-General appears ashamed at the lie he has told, and even Frederic's expedition with the local Police force against the Pirates fails to revive his spirits. The Police are equipped with good tunes but bad nerves and they march off relunctantly.

Frederic is now shaken to learn from Ruth and the Pirate King that he must remain a Pirate, because, having been born in a leap year, he is really only 5. His sense of duty compels him to rejoin them and to inform them of the Major-General's lie. When he tries to explain the situation to Mabel, he promises to return to claim her hand in about 70 years' time.

The Police are indignant, puzzled and further unnerved by the new situation, hiding at the approach of the Pirates who, in turn hide from the Major-General and his daughters. He, of course, is doomed, and the Police can do nothing to save him. As a last hope, the Sergeant invokes the Queen's name, bringing the Pirates to their knees. Ruth rescues them by informing the Police that they are really noblemen who have 'gone wrong'. This is welcome news for the Major-General who thinks he can now marry his daughters into the Peerage. Thus all ends happily.






