





THE STORY

Mrs Dolly Gallagher Levi, widowed ten years ago spends her time and earns her living "arranging things", but so far has not succeeded in organising a second husband for herself. Horace Vandergelder, a well-known half-a-millionaire and the proprietor of a store in Yonkers, becomes her target, but he intends to marry Irene Molloy, a young and attractive hat shop proprietress. Tongue in cheek Dolly suggests another possibility, Ernestina Money who is to play a prominent part in the Fourteenth Street Parade later that day.

Vandergelder leaves for New York; his two clerks, Cornelius and Barnaby find a novel but noisy way of closing the store for the rest of the day, and make for the bright lights of Broadway. Closely following is Vandergelder's tearful niece Ermengarde and her fiance, Ambrose Kemper bound for fame and fortune in the polka contest which is to take place that night at the Harmonia Gardens Restaurant

Dolly follows Vandergelder to New York where she succeeds in sabotaging Vandergelder's proposal to Mrs Molloy; he reluctantly accepts Dolly's second proposal of Miss Money, but Miss Money is not at all what Vandergelder had expected. Dolly, who has not been to the Harmonia Gardens Restaurant since her husband died is given a royal welcome by the staff and she has arranged various match-making attempts to take place there.

Vandergelder gets a shock to find his two clerks, his niece Ermengarde and Ambrose there; Vandergelder loses his wallet and a disturbance follows culminating in all present being arrested and taken to court. Dolly however knows the Judge and everyone is dismissed except Vandergelder who finds himself without, clerks, niece and now bride - will he now turn to Dolly?
