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


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

THE STORY

The Pirates are celebrating Frederic's coming of age and the completion of his apprenticeship. He was apprenticed as a Pirate rather than as a Pilot because Ruth, his nurserymaid, is hard of hearing. At 12 o'clock Frederic will be free and Ruth, the only woman he has seen since boyhood, hopes to go with him.

When he meets the daughters of Major-General Stanley he realises that Ruth is no young beauty. But he is spurned by the girls. Mabel takes pity on him; Frederic warns them about the Pirates, but too late, the girls seem about to be married off to the Pirates when the Major-General appears and pleads that he cannot spare his daughters, as he is an orphan

In Act II the Major - General confesses that he has lied, and even Frederic's expedition with the local Police fails to revive his spirits. The Police are equipped with good tunes but bad nerves and they march off reluctantly.

Frederic is now shaken to learn that he is really only 5 because he was born in a Leap Year, but he promises to come back and marry Mabel in 70 years' time.

The Police are indignant and puzzled, hiding at the approach of the pirates, who hide from the Major-General and his daughters. He is doomed and the Police cannot save him. As a last hope the Sergeant invokes the Queen's name, bringing the Pirates to their knees. Ruth rescues them by telling the Police they are really nobleman who have "gone wrong" - welcome news for the Major-General, who thinks he can now marry his daughters into the Peerage. Thus all ends happily.




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

He is Chairman of CO2 and Business Manager for COS. From the age of 6 he has participated in a total of 52 stage productions, both on and backstage. This will be the third time he has played Frederic making it his twenty-fourth principal role. All Mark's spare time is taken up with amateur theatre.







MABEL - Joanna Daniels joined the Society at 14 for Carousel as a dancer. She performed for several years with CO2 and played Maria in West Side Story. She then trained at Guildford School of Acting in Musical Theatre. Joanna rejoined COS to play Mabel in Pirates; other roles she has enjoyed are Julie Jordan in Carousel and Rapunzel in Into the Woods.

MAJOR - GENERAL STANLEY- Vic Edwards has performed many times with COS in a variety of roles. His first lead was as Gaylord Ravenal in Showboat in 1980. Her vast experience has been put to use as choreographer and dance captain. She played Hattie In Kiss Me Kate, but her favourite role was Valencienne in The Merry Widow.



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
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EDITH – Barbara Ryan joined the Society in 1974 and her first role was Cupid in Orpheus in the Underworld. Since then she has appeared in most of the COS productions. Three favourite characters have been Nellie Forbrush in South Pacific, Eliza Doolittle in My Fair Lady, and Ann in Half a Sixpence. Her other roles have been in Fiddler on the Roof, Ethel in The Music Man, Laurie in Oklahoma, Diana in Orpheus in the Underworld in 1994 and Irene Molloy last year in Hello Dolly.






ISABEL – Emma Spurgeon has been involved with COS all her life, but her first performance was in CO2's first production of Grease. Emma has performed in numerous shows and has enjoyed playing principal roles which include Frenchie in Grease, Lily in Annie, Herb in Godspell and Peggie Sawyer in 42nd Street. Emma has also played thigh – slapping Prince Charming in Cinderella at Clacton – one of her favourite roles.

SERGEANT OF POLICE – Lee Carter stepped onto the stage at 14 as a shark in West Side Story with CO2. Since then he has appeared in Godspell, Guys and Dolls as Benny Southstreet, Grease as Kinicki, Anything Goes as Moonface Martin, and in Annie as Rooster. Lee also played Jesus in Godspell which COS presented in Delft in 1994. This is the second time he has played the Sergeant of Police – next time he wants to play something else.





SAMUEL – Stephen Thompson Pirates marks Steve's debut with COS. He is no stranger to the Theatre having performed with MLADS, WORMS and Gatsby Mill in Chelmsford. A keen squash player and fisherman, Steve is delighted to be treading the boards with such an accomplished cast.
