MY FAIR LADY - THE STORY

The humble flower girl – Eliza changing into the Duchess – well the star of the ball – Cinderella set in the London of the 1910's. Eliza attracts the attention of Professor Higgins, an expert on dialects; his encounter with Col. Pickering leads to the boast that within six months Higgins can pass her off as a Duchess. The fact that he succeeds, despite her exasperation at his methods, and then his ignoring her eventual triumph leads to a silent reconciliation that for many is the highlight – and finale of the show.

It's difficult to realise that in six weeks time it will be the 50th. anniversary of My Fair Lady opening in New York. It was regarded then by the critics as a future classic – how right they were!


