The world's greatest love story takes to the streets in this landmark Broadway musical that is one of the theatre's finest accomplishments. Shakespeare's 'Romeo and Juliet' is transported to modern-day New York City, as two young idealistic lovers find themselves caught between warring street gangs, the American 'Jets' and the Puerto Rican 'Sharks'.

The original Broadway production, opened at the Winter Garden Theatre on September 26th 1957, and the initial response was mixed, with critics thinking the show 'clever but cold and lacking in heart'. The show's producer Hal Prince recalls audience members walking out, as many as '200' at some performances. West Side Story was not an instant success and not the phenomenon that it is today, in fact the big success of that year was Meredith Willison and Franthi Lacey's 'The Music Man', which went on to win the Tony Award for Best Musical.

The show's popularity began with the release of the 1961 film version, starring Richard Beymer and Natalie Wood as the 'star crossed' lovers, directed by Robert Wise and Jerome Robbins. The film does make some significant changes from the original production; most notably the male sharks being involved in "America" and the changing of the order of the songs "Officer Krupke" and "Cool".

The show that you will be watching tonight is an interpretation of the original stage production. It is 56 years since the first night of 'West Side Story' and it is clear that the transcending themes are still as relevant to us today with the lover's story and their struggle to survive in a world of hate, violence and prejudice. With its mesmerising score it shows why 'West Side Story' is one of the most innovative, heartwrenching and relevant musical dramas of our time.

'West Side Story' is Hyoie's debut show for CO2, and is thrilled to have been given the chance to play Tony. Hyoie has a strong passion for Musical Theatre, performing in many productions at East Bergholt High School. Amongst one of his favourites was the role of Henry Jekyll in 'Jekyll and Hyde.' As well as Musical Theatre he has a strong interest in singing, and is the lead singer in 'Smalltalk', which is a local functions band.

Shannon Hannah - Anybodys

Shannon joined CO2 as a studio singer in 'Footloose' she then progressed into the ensemble for 'Oklahoma!' She was a Hot Box dancer in 'Guys and Dolls' and also the shows dance captain for which due to all her hard work she was the recipient of the CO2 shield. Shannon is also involved in performing outside the society with Mad Hatter Productions and KATS theatre group, where earlier in the year she played the part of Snow White in 'Snow White and the Seven Dwarves.' Shannon has just completed a diploma course in Musical Theatre at Colchester Institute and has just started their 3 year degree course in Musical Theatre.





Jenny Collins – Maria

This is also Jenny's debut show for CO2, joining after being impressed with last year's performance of 'Guys and Dolls.' You may recognise her as she is no stranger to the Mercury stage having performed in their Youth Productions such as 'Hard Times' and their pantomimes, the most recent being 'Jack and the Beanstalk.' Dallyce Thiessen- Anita


Making her CO2 debut last year as a Hot Box dancer in 'Guys and Dolls', Dallyce is thrilled to be back to take on the challenging role of Anita. Originally from Canada Dallyce moved to the UK in 2009, where she got involved in productions at Philip Morant, taking the roles of Dorothy in 'The Wizard of Oz' in 2010 and Scaramouche in 'We Will Rock You' earlier this year. Dallyce has also been involved with COS appearing as a taxi dancer in 'Sweet Charity' earlier this year. Dallyce has just completed her A-levels and is currently taking a year out of studies, with the aim of going into the performing arts in the future.

Barney Fritz - Action

CO2 History

CO2 was formed in 1984 with the aim to give 11-23 year olds a chance to perform in the amateur society. Starting with Grease in 1984 we have gone on to stage a wide variety of shows including; 'Guys and Dolls', 'Godspell', 'Fame', 'The Wiz', 'Oklahoma!' and in 2007 we staged a sell out run of 'We Will Rock You.' One of the key elements of CO2 is to give the chance for young inspiring performers to develop their talents. This has lead many CO2 alumni onto further training and progressing into the professional world. 'West Side Story' has been a popular choice for CO2, encompassing the perfect mix of singing, dancing and acting in roles which closely identify with the age band of CO2. The first time 'West Side Story' was performed was in 1988 at the Lakeside Theatre. The show was first presented at the Mercury Theatre in 1995, in which our current assistant to the director/choreographer Leanne Fincham played the role of Anita, Leanne was also involved in the third presentation of the show in 2005 when she assisted Dani Fincham our then director and choreographer and it has been great having Leanne's in-depth experience in this current staging of 'West Side Story.' 2014 will be a very special year for CO2 as we celebrate our 30th anniversary, we would like to invite you to join us celebrate, as we present 'Grease', the show where it all began, and we are delighted to welcome back Dani Fincham as our director who played Miss Lynch in CO2's original production, keep a look out for dates very soon!!






