

Hello from Colchester Operatic Society

Welcome to this amazing venue, Mercury at Abbey Field, and this joint Mercury Theatre and Colchester Operatic Society production of **Oliver!**

As a society, we have performed our annual COS and CO2 musical productions at the Mercury Theatre since it opened in 1972. During this time, we have developed a strong working relationship with the Mercury Theatre, which has admired the success and professional quality of our amateur productions.

The Mercury creative team have been keen to work with us to put on a Made in Colchester production. This idea has, up until now, been a pipe dream, but with the temporary closure of the theatre, this amazing opportunity to collaborate became a reality.

This pop-up theatre is a new venue for us both. After many meetings to discuss the project and how it would work, a collaboration of our members as the cast, working with the Mercury Theatre production team with help from our backstage crew, began.

We needed a show that all our members (from both the main Society, COS, aged 16 and over, and our younger edition, CO2, aged 11 to 23) could be part of and which would draw in audiences to fill this amazing 800+ seater venue. It didn't take long to decide on **Oliver!**

We are an amateur society that meets up once or twice a week. So working with the Mercury production team, who are used to working with professional actors committed to a four week block rehearsal period, has challenged us both to adapt to different ways of working. We are proud of our members who have risen to the challenge and enjoyed the experience.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone at the Mercury who have helped with this production and for having the confidence to combine with the society and produce this amazing show. We would also like to thank our hard-working cast and all of our members who have helped behind the scenes.

Thank you to all our committee members for their continuing, often unseen, hard work managing the society and our productions.

If you enjoy **Oliver!** please look out for our COS concert **Dare to be Different** in February, while CO2 will be back at the Mercury Theatre in September/October 2020 so keep a look out for details!


Under the Made in Colchester brand, the Mercury creates theatre which reaches audiences and generates critical attention regionally and nationally. The Mercury is a champion of regional arts, both as an active co-producer with other venues and companies and also touring our own productions to audiences across the UK.

In 2019, our final Made in Colchester production in the theatre in its previous form, **Ain't Misbehavin'**, played to critical acclaim. We are thrilled to announce that this co-production with Paul Taylor-Mills has been nominated for multiple awards, including The Stage Debut Theatre Award for Best Director, and West End Wilma's Best Off-West End Show Award.

The Mercury Theatre is currently undergoing large scale redevelopment work as part of the Mercury Rising capital project. We will reopen our new building with an exciting season of shows in September 2020, including new Made in Colchester productions across all of our main performance spaces, our much loved Mercury pantomime, and a host of visiting performances including comedy, music, drama and more.

MERCURY RISING IS AN EXCITING CAPITAL PROJECT THAT WILL MODERNISE AND TRANSFORM OUR MUCH-LOVED THEATRE, SAFEGUARDING ITS FUTURE FOR THE WHOLE COMMUNITY. THESE IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE:

Director's Note



Working on this production of Lionel Bart's musical masterpiece I've been swept away by the power of community.

This is truly a unique and ground-breaking production for the Mercury, which has teamed up with Colchester Operatic Society to conjure a musical with a professional creative team and an amateur cast.

I didn't know what to expect when we joined forces with COS to present a production of **Oliver!** but from auditions right up until opening night I've been blown away by everyone involved - backstage and front, young and old - they have worked tirelessly to bring this story to life amidst laughter, excitement and the pure joy of working together.

During rehearsals, I've had to re-evaluate my understanding of the word 'amateur'. I think that sometimes in the theatre industry it can have a negative connotation and yet my recent experience of working with the 'amateurs' has revealed them to be nothing but professional.

Every member of the Operatic Society gives 100 per cent, not because they're being paid a lucrative sum but because they love it; it's their true passion. It's worth remembering we were all amateurs once and we become artists by creating art. I am reminded of the phrase, "Professionals built the Titanic but amateurs built the Ark."

Listening to 40 adult and 20 young performers singing **Consider Yourself** for the first time is goose-bump inducing and the perfect metaphor for what community theatre should be.

It has been a truly inspiring experience and I hope you enjoy the fruits of our musical labour.
